

This is a book that I would certainly use if I were an educator. It explains concepts in a clear, concise manner and raises numerous important questions for both serious and casual students of the subject matter to consider. Additionally, it includes a section devoted entirely to career advice for those who wish to pursue the study of International Affairs at a higher level. Those who prefer a more Rationalist approach may be disappointed by the fact that the book does not take any amount of time to address logic games or otherwise present a quantitative approach to political science. However, this is a large part of what makes the book accessible and approachable to casual students. Were I teaching an International Relations 101 class to Freshmen at a community college, this would be my first choice to assign my students. I have read this book for fun and it functions as a perfect complement to the textbooks I actually have been assigned as a student of International Relations. Indeed, it even helps function to clarify concepts that other texts intentionally obfuscate. While certain passages of the text make clear the fact that this book was written specifically for students, I would highly recommend it to the casual reader as well.
