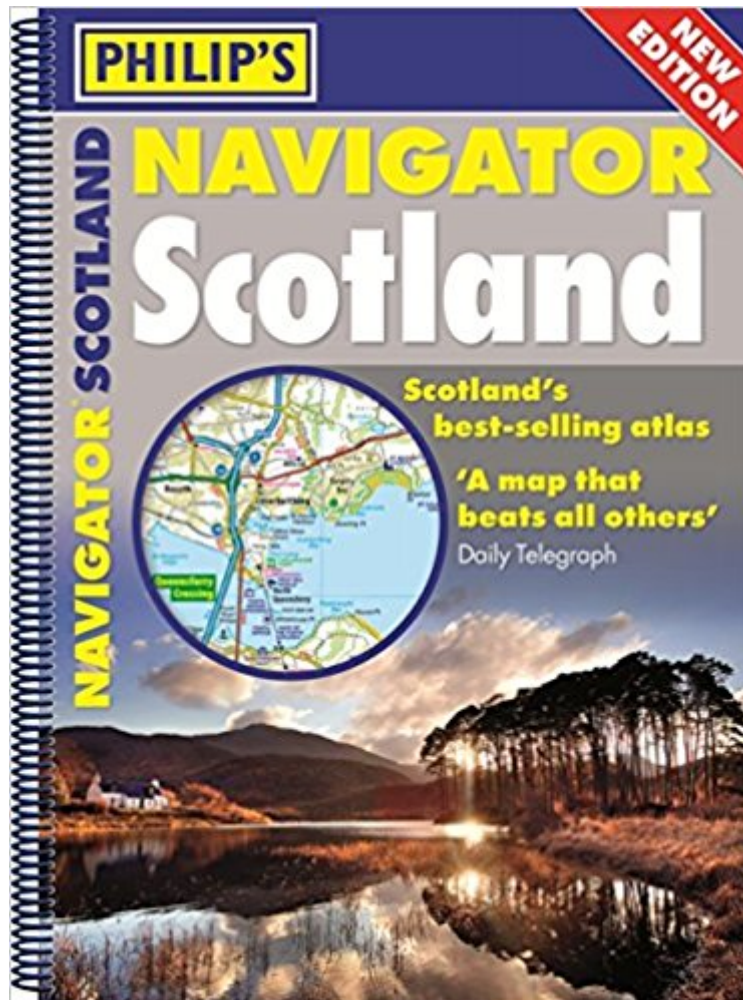

My only complaint is that there's insufficient detail for urban areas. This doesn't seem an unreasonable request considering how few cities there are in the country! Still, I highly recommend it to anyone planning to drive in Scotland. We used it in conjunction with a folding road map and in addition to SatNav/GPS. In spite of some wrong turns we had a very successful trip and are pleased we traveled independently. Driving on the left down narrow roads was challenging at times but the rewards were bountiful!

Good "trip planning" map book but nothing compared to a good navigation system when driving. You can't read a map AND drive in Scotland. You'll end up in a ditch!

We purchased a detailed driving tour from Secret Scotland, and this atlas was purchased to compliment the driving directions provided with the tour. We are not going to Scotland until the summer, so until we get in country, I won't know for certain how good or accurate the maps are. So far, though, as I am reading the driving directions in the tour, I am able to follow along exactly on the maps and have not come across any roads in the directions that I could not locate on the map/atlas. I am certain that this atlas will prove invaluable once we start driving around Scotland. My only complaint is that the town center detail maps are tiny. Edinburgh and Glasgow map are only given about one third of a page, and the smaller towns barely one quarter. The rest of the page is filled with a street index. It would have been nicer to have full page town center maps. [Belated update Nov 2014] This atlas was everything that I hoped it would be. We drove from Edinburgh to Inverness to Skye to Oban to Stirling and back again, and never got lost (even when we deviated from the Secret Scotland directions). We did not use a GPS at any time on the trip and just relied on our trusty road atlas. Thank you Philips!

This is a great guide; however, for me, I ordered it a tad late. I was told it could take up to twenty days for delivery and unfortunately, it came the day after I left for Scotland. After return, I looked at all the places that we had visited and had wished I had this navigator in hand while there. Well worth the value for navigating around Scotland.

Rented a wifi adapter while there but service was spotty. I would have been lost without this! Very clear and easy to follow. Great legend and tons of points of interest.

Appears to be the excellent road guide resource we need for our upcoming road trip through the

Highlands. It is also compact enough to carry easily and won't take up much room in suitcase or day pack.

Even better than the Michelin for Great Britain (including Scotland) that I previously had. The Philip's Navigator was easier to read and had more EXTRA information (scotch distilleries, museums, ancient standing stones, ferry times between sites and more) than any others I've seen.

It was compact enough to fit in a pocket of my carry-on bag, but the maps lacked detail. The city maps are particularly lacking--I found better maps in hotel lobbies in Glasgow to help me locate train and bus stations. I also spent a lot of time looking at Google Maps on my phone when I had a w-fi connection. Then the text in the index of attractions was so small I wished I had my granny's magnifying glass. The spiral binding is great, however.

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
