Spinster by Suzanne G. Rogers is a sweet romance set in England during the 1890's. It begins with the homecoming of Clare's fiancée. Unfortunately, he arrives in London with a wife in tow. Although the late nineteenth century was more enlightened, society was still not kind or accepting of a woman who had been jilted. If she was blessed with independent means or a generous family who was wealthy, she could leave the city and live a quiet, lonely life in the country. Clare feels it would reflect poorly on her younger sister's first Season by attending balls and events after being put on the shelf by her intended. What Clare doesn't bargain for, is the intrusion on her property by an unknown neighbor that has dammed up the very spring that feeds Clare's garden and home. Furious at this act, Clare attempts to dismantle the small dam in order to restore her cottage to its former self. Before long, she begins to feel part of the village and meets Meriweather, a handsome business owner. Soon it becomes apparent that there is much more to Mr. Holcroft than originally meets Clare's sparkling eyes. Can Clare really adapt to spinsterhood in a hamlet with intrusive neighbors and gentlemanly merchants? Young readers will be treated to a delightful story that illustrates how delicate the social balancing act is in this era.

Seriously, not many authors seem to be able to pull off a romance without sex, but this was great. I loved this woman. She is a little ahead of her time, but not so much that you know she'll never really be happy living in her own life. Great characters, great story, and I liked that there was no real villain.
