

# Building Spelling Skills: Grade 1



## **Synopsis**

In Building Spelling Skills Daily Practice, Grade 1, students will learn five spelling words per week in lists 114; then eight words per week in lists 1530 (198 total). One or two sentences for dictation are provided for each list. Spelling lists include the following: short and long vowel words, adding s and es, words with sh, nt, nd, sounds of ow, ar, aw, oa, and present and past tense words. Practice pages for each unit include the following: a spelling list with spaces to read, write, and spell each word, a configuration puzzle for every spelling list, word sorting, word meaning (filling in missing spelling words in sentences), and exercises to find the misspellings and hidden words.

Reproducible forms include: spelling record form, individual spelling record, spelling test form, spelling list form, word sort form, and a parent letter.

I use spelling books to individualize lists for kids in my special education class. The early grade books were great with lists of no more than 10 words so I was disappointed to see that this book's

lists have 15 words. I'm not sure if the kids who need to learn 3rd grade spelling will be successful with this book as is. I would rather have mastery of 10, than just getting by with 15. Otherwise, the book is great as a black line master. No color print, nice learning activities. Each week has a study page for the word list, and 3 supporting activity pages. There are 30 weekly units.

My son just turned 8 and is already a decent speller, but this is just the right amount of challenge for him. I love how clear the directions are and that it has 4 lessons a week. It really drills the spelling list in without being monotonous or boring.

This book is obviously designed to be used as a "blackline master" in a classroom setting. The book assumes you will be making copies of everything to distribute; in other words, this is not a consumable workbook that you can easily use with one/your child. As far as content goes, I feel it is age-appropriate. I taught 1st grade in the public school system for 5 years and am now homeschooled my daughter (1st grade). I thought I could use this for our spelling program this year -- I liked the activities, the sentence dictation, the word lists. But like I said, this is not a consumable workbook. There is only one "test" page, way in the back/appendix of the book, meant to be copied over and over. And there are little annoyances: you can't tear out pages to use because they are on the back of the next lesson, etc. Final word: not intended for single-student use.

I LOVE Evan-Moor products regardless, but this specific book is a WONDERFUL resource to use in addition to your spelling program in place at the elementary school. I purchased this book to aide my instruction and help facilitate learning in the classroom. When used as AM/Morning/Bell work for the students to warm up with, it's a fantastic tool to have in the classroom. I have both the third and fourth grade books. This particular book gives the students 18 words to work with for the week. Each are linked with a specific spelling rule and relate to each other in some way. Perfect way to teach spelling patterns in our English language. Very helpful resource!

This book is perfect for a supplement for my homeschool with my 3rd grader. It is more than just a spelling list which really helps in learning the words, not just memorizing them for a test.

We like all of the Evan Moor products and I use them as a parent to provide additional instruction to school work. Each weekly section starts off with a guidance for the teacher...which is great for me as a parent who is \*not\* a teacher.
