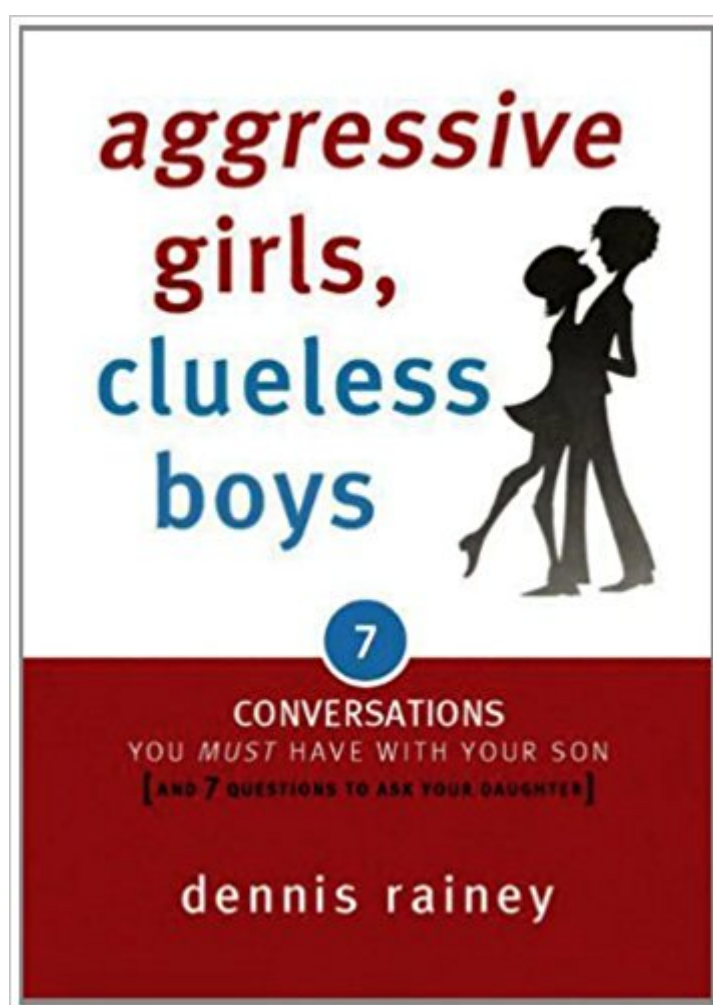

Any parent with a teenage son will find this book helpful and informative. The book provides the context and guidance for seven conversations a parent needs to have with their son helping him develop a game plan, God's plan, for maintaining sexual purity in the direct face of temptation. The book includes real-life scenarios, questions, and answers from real parents. There is an Epilogue for parents with 7 questions they should ask their daughter.

It's a quick read with a straightforward message: the rules of courtship and dating have changed, and parents must approach this topic with their children so they have the knowledge and tools to navigate teen life with their eyes wide open. The tools provided by this book are geared towards Christians who believe sex is best reserved for marriage, and uses scripture to back up the

message as well as many stories, questions, and guided conversations that parents might use to approach this topic with their children. As with all parenting books there will be parts where you'll nod your head in appreciation, and parts that you'll skip over because it doesn't fit your beliefs or parenting style. This book doesn't force you into one world view, but simply lays out the types of situations they've seen and how you might be able to teach your children to handle those situations. As an active member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints (i.e. Mormon), I found it useful in a general sense, and I will be able to use many of the thoughts and teachings with my own sons.

Appreciated this book. It's focus is to help parents facilitate discussions on sexuality with our kids (both genders) and is very realistic. The author is very clear that the issues of aggressive boys are NOT minimized, but the focus of this book is one that has been a challenge since the beginning of time - the passivity of men. His call is to work with your son to step up to biblical manhood and your daughter to biblical womanhood. Through the guided questions, one can get to the heart of what their child is facing, role-play scenarios, and discuss real sin issues that they face.

As principal of a Christian school for almost 30 years, I have to agree with the author's premise that pre-teen and teen girls today are more forward and flirtatious than they were a generation ago. Sadly, the shocking stories he relates of girls basically throwing themselves on boys and offering themselves sexually are becoming more common-place; I could come up with several stories of my own to add to each chapter. As a father, I found the book to be informative, motivating, and challenging to get out of my comfort zone and have some conversations with my children. I was able to read the book in one sitting to get the overview and can go back and use the chapter reviews with questions to help my teens in the weeks and months ahead. In my opinion, the missing chapter is about how today's popular media (music, movies, entertainment, etc) continually sexualize kids and push them to think and act in the aggressive way warned about in the book. Should we be filtering and controlling those influences more? Don't be a clueless parent or teacher! Get aggressive in dealing with this important issue in your teens' lives! You only have one chance!
