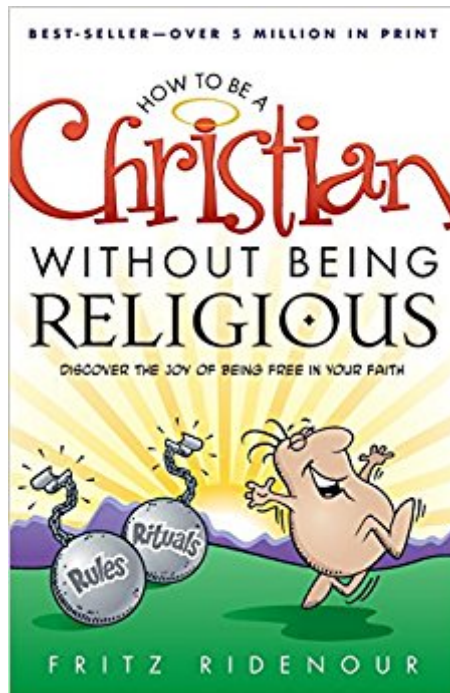

This is an excellent book that walks the reader through Paul's letter to the Romans, provides challenging questions to think about the material from different vantage points, and cites cross reference passages in the Bible to encourage the reader to dig a bit deeper. Poignant illustrations give supporting visuals that keep the reader focused. I first read this book 30 years ago and its

message is just as applicable today as it was then. I strongly recommend this book for anyone who is confused about what it really means to be a Christian--especially if they have come out of churches entrenched with dogmas, rules, and regulations.
