

Adventures Of A Female Medical Detective: In Pursuit Of Smallpox And AIDS



Synopsis

In 1974, a young doctor arrived at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention with one goal in mind: to help eradicate smallpox. The only woman physician in her class in the Epidemic Intelligence Service, a two-year epidemiology training program, Mary Guinan soon was selected to join Indiaâ™s Smallpox Eradication Program, which searched out and isolated patients with the disease. By May of 1975, the World Health Organization declared Uttar Pradesh smallpox-free. During her barrier-crossing career, Dr. Guinan met arms-seeking Afghan insurgents in Pakistan and got caught in the cross fire between religious groups in Lebanon. She treated some of the first AIDS patients and served as an expert witness in defense of a pharmacist who was denied employment for having HIVâ• leading to a landmark decision that still protects HIV patients from workplace discrimination. Mary Guinan, PhD, MD, was the founding dean of the School of Community Health Sciences at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, and is now professor emerita. She was the first woman to serve as the chief scientific advisor to the director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Anne D. Mather was the managing editor of the CDC newsletter, the MMWR, during the years when smallpox was eradicated and AIDS was discovered.

I think that many non-fiction books are too long and would have been better off as long articles in a journal or magazine. I feel the opposite way about this book; it was too short and didn't include enough details. So many layers of richness are missing. For example, she and another doctor are assigned to assess the health of women and children in a refugee camp. Getting there is very dangerous, and she travels with a large group, but almost nothing is said about the journey. Then she says almost nothing about the camp or the women. She writes that at the end of their health survey, the other doctor leaves and she stays to write up the conclusions, but she doesn't tell the readers anything about her conclusions. The author has lead a fascinating life, but this book needs a different co-author to bring the full story to life.

This book is a "must read" for every student looking for a career that offers unexpected adventures, medical detective work, and the chance to make a real difference in the world! Through her own life stories, Dr Mary Guinan shows the excitement of a career in the front lines of public health. Don't miss it!
