

Great read for those serious about their research.

A informative and fun book with only two criticisms:1. The book rambles. It is a bit too wordy.2. On page 41 the author states that Luke and Matthew agreed that Jesus was born during Herod the Great's time; however; this is problematic. According to Luke, Jesus was born during the rule of Quirinius, which began sometime between 6 or 7 a.d. There is, at least, a 10 year discrepancy that

While scholarly in nature, this book is not so dry that it can't appeal to the curious layman. In "The Origins of Christmas", the author gives us the historical origins of the date of the celebration of Christmas, the origins of many of the traditions surrounding Christmas (such as the names and nature of the 'wise men'), and some of the modern traditions (such as the Christmas tree) as well. Well written and well researched. An asset to the library not only of the biblical or Church scholar, but the curious layman as well.

This is a fine popular introduction to the development of Christmas in the late ancient Christian era. It's relatively short so not exceptionally detailed, so it best served as a first look into the early history of Christmas.

Teaches you about the symbolism and origin of Christmas. Goes more in-depth than the traditional story and is a good read.
